- **Purpose:** To gain an understanding of what other Teams are capable of

 - ◆ Data Sources

- **Data Analysis**

Data Collection

- **Purpose:** To collect data and information on the performance and abilities of other Teams

- **Data Sources**
 - ◆ Match Scouting
 - ◆ Pit Scouting
 - ◆ The Blue Alliance

- **Measures**
 - ◆ Quantitative
 - ◆ Qualitative
 - ◆ Cooperation

Data Analysis

- **Purpose:** To use collected data on other Teams to improve your Team's decision-making
- **Match Strategy**
 - ◆ Robot adaptations
 - ◆ Score prediction
 - ◆ Counter-play & Chokeholds
- **"Pick List"**
 - ◆ Alliance Selection rankings
 - ◆ Best-fit Teams

Team Resources

- **Determine your Team's available resources before deciding how your Team should approach Scouting**

- **Team members**
 - ◆ **Number of available Students and Mentors**
 - ◆ **Experience**
 - ◆ **Time investment**

- **Scouting equipment/Technology**
 - ◆ **Money**
 - ◆ **Convenience**

Sample Methods

→ Ranking Method

- ◆ Track overall relative performance of Teams
- ◆ Simple & effective
- ◆ Resource efficient

→ Worksheet Method

- ◆ Track type and amount of match activity of Teams
- ◆ More complex
- ◆ Larger variety of data measures
